### Regional Impact

\$15M+ to community organizations in 2022 in grants, matching gifts, sponsorships, volunteer time, in-kind and other donations to nonprofit organizations in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island

- Nearly \$8M in Foundation grants
- \$1.5M+ from employees, board members and the Foundation to 600+ local nonprofits through our Match Program
- **\$2.3M+** in corporate and Foundation sponsorship support
- Nearly **\$360K** in volunteer service (9,326 hours)

### In 2022, 17 Connecticut organizations received grants totaling \$932,500. Highlights:

- \$50,000 one-year general operating support grant to Black Infinity Collective in New Haven, a freedom fighting, movement-building organization dedicated to healing and liberation for all Black people (formerly known as CT Core-Organize Now!)
- \$300,000 three-year grant to **Connecticut Area Agencies on Aging** to support an "Aging Answers" network that is more accessible to older residents and their families
- \$100,000 one-year general operating support grant to **Connecticut Foodshare** in Wallingford, an organization that purchases and distributes fresh and non-perishable food and advocates for system and policy changes addressing root causes of hunger aligned with National Strategy on Hunger, Nutrition, and Health
- \$90,000 three-year general operating support grant to **FEED Center** in Bridgeport, an organization working to increase access to fresh, local and healthy food for those experiencing economic uncertainty
- \$200,000 two-year general operating support grant to **NAMI Connecticut** in West Harford, an organization working to improve the quality of life for people with mental illness and their families through support, education, and advocacy
